We have one family-friendly service, which includes children, and starts at 9:00 am with Sunday School from 10:30 to 11:30 am. Communion is celebrated every Sunday. On months with a 5th Sunday, we have a healing service with communion. We enjoy a blended traditional and contemporary service using both hymns and current music. The liturgical style rotates six+ different types of services. A worship team consisting of singers, drums, piano, and other instruments lead the music during the service. We use traditional bulletins and projection screens during services. The pastor and/or member of the congregation leads a children's lesson each Sunday. We have one large Christmas Eve service, one large Easter service, and Wednesday Evening Advent and Lenten Services.

Prince of Peace was founded as a mission congregation in May 1960 and held its first worship service in September of that year. By the end of the year, POP had 164 baptized members and an annual budget of approximately \$13,000. The congregation continued to grow and refinanced the building loan in 1976, thereby moving from "mission" status.

During its history, POP has been served by twelve pastors. Our previous Senior Pastor served the congregation for 17 years.

Within the last few years, POP has not only moved into a new, larger building, but has also increased the preschool enrollment, and celebrated its 50-year anniversary.

Prince of Peace is a family of believers in God, called by the gospel of Jesus Christ to welcome, nurture and equip each other for worship, witness and loving service to God and all people.
