Saint Martin is located in Atlanta Georgia and is currently leasing from Heritage Preparatory School in a historical Church that was built over 100 years ago with an inspiring Sanctuary for Worship.

The congregation is mostly European Caucasian descendants. The age breakdown as follows:

Saint Martin Lutheran Church is a Christian congregation in the Lutheran liturgical confessional tradition, gathered and strengthened by Word and Sacrament in worship of the Triune God, whereby we are empowered to perform mission and ministry of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in our community and throughout the world.

**What are the primary goals of your congregation?**

- Call a full-time Pastor to lead the congregation in scripturally grounded worship, learning and service.
- Double the worship attendance by building programs for the Christian education of the youth and adults in the congregation.
- Obtain a permanent location and church facility that is 100% controlled by Saint Martin Lutheran Church as we grow our congregation in the future.

**Describe your congregation's worship practice (liturgy, hymns, vestments, music, hymnals, and frequency of Holy Communion).**

Each Sunday we celebrate the presence of the Triune God hearing the Word and gather at the Lord's Table. We follow the Church (liturgical) year with an annual cycle of seasons and days observed in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. We follow the Evangelical Lutheran Worship Book. We have four readings from the Bible each week during worship, often from the Old Testament, Psalms, the New Testament and one of the Four Gospels. Vestments are worn every Sunday and the Choir wears robes as well. The music is from the worship book and is chosen by the Music Director and approved by the Pastor for the service.

**Describe your congregation's Christian education ministry.**

We provide education classes each Sunday for all ages, helping each person grow in faith. We have a Lutheran Pastor who leads adult Sunday School and volunteer teachers for the Children's Sunday School. We have a Men's Bible Study that meets on Monday mornings throughout the year. We provide The Word in Season to all who come to Saint Martin and encourage our people to read the bible daily.

**Describe the congregation's current activities for mission and outreach.**

We live our faith serving others, those who come to our church and those who will never come. Jesus tells us to care for others, to be helpful to those in need. Community food drives for a local food pantry (Toco Hills Community Alliance), collecting diapers for a women's charity (Helping Mamas), and serving with our gifts and talents in the community. We provide support to the NALC Great Commission Fund Global and NALC Great Commission Fund National.

**What were the three most significant results of the workshop?**

1. The congregation felt good about being a part of the call of the new Pastor as most came from congregations that had a call committee and they chose the Pastor without congregational input.
2. Need to have more fellowship activities with members of the Church be it at someone's home or meeting elsewhere to get together so that we know each other on more than just a Church basis. At least once a month.
3. Need to do a better job with evangelism for the Church.

We have not had any significant or recent conflicts within the congregation. This congregation was started because of the social and political issues within the ELCA and the move away from the liturgical worship service which we as Lutherans revere. The formation of a new congregation in a different Synod was a deeply difficult decision for many but the congregation is very comfortable in and excited for the new life and growth potential engendered by Saint Martin Lutheran Church. The NALC has welcomed Saint Martin and we intend to grow and continue in steadfast support of the NALC.

He has knitted us together, focused us on Jesus Christ, and encouraged us to spread the word to all. He led us through on-line audio church services and Zoom audio/visual Council meetings during Covid and the congregation grew during that time because of his ability to preach the word about Jesus. We would like for Pastor Clark to be able to return to retirement life with his family in peace and joy from a job well done
