Fiction and Fact: The Writings of Bishop Bo Giertz

Lutheran Churches are among those that describe themselves as being “Confessional Churches”. That is to say that we think that doctrine is important, despite any number of admonitions over the years to dispense with a doctrinal approach to preaching and catechesis. But taking that approach has led to churches being blown astray by the ever shifting Zeitgeist. We are convinced that we need more doctrine, not less, if we are to speak God’s truth into a confused world.

The problem is that doctrines can be both hard to understand, and harder apply to real world situations. The writings of Bishop Bo Giertz have proven themselves to be a useful tool in addressing this problem. Many people have found *The Hammer Of God* to be indispensable in both understanding the doctrine of Law and Gospel, and of preaching accordingly. His novel *Faith Alone: The Heart Of Everything*, recently translated by Pastor Bror Erickson, does the same with the doctrine of the Two Kingdoms.

In the words of last year’s speaker, Chad Bird: *“When I caught wind of a rumor that the novel Erickson was currently translating, Faith Alone: The Heart of Everything, was actually better than The Hammer of God, I scoffed. ... Then I picked up a copy and began to read. I say “read” but that’s not exactly accurate. To say I was “reading” is like saying a parched man is “drinking.” I was guzzling, folks, imbibing page after page. And—I kid you not—I was in suspense until the closing page, keen to see how Giertz would usher his narrative to its surprise dénouement. I was not disappointed. Nor am I the least bit ashamed to say that I am gladly eating crow over my initial unbelief about Faith Alone outdoing The Hammer of God. Without a doubt, it does.”*

Our Speaker



Pastor Bror Erickson graduated from Concordia Theological Seminary at Ft. Wayne, IN in 2004. He served as a pastor in Tooele, Utah from 2004-2014 and is currently serving with his second call at Zion Lutheran Church in Farmington, New Mexico, where he lives with his wife Laura. Bror is a contributor to 1517.org and is an avid reader and translator of Bo Giertz. Bror’s first introduction to Bo Giertz was in 1996 in Rome, when he was stationed at Aviano Air Base with the US Air Force. Subsequently, Bror learned Swedish so he could read and translate other works of Bo Giertz. Pastor Erickson’s first Giertz translation project was *To Live with Christ* while on vicarage. Since then he has completed translations of *The Knights of Rhodes*, *Then Fell the Lord’s Fire*, *With My Own Eyes*, and Bo Giertz’s commentary on Romans. Bror has also translated *Witness* by Hermann Sasse, and contributed to *A Hammer for God* essays in honor of Bo Giertz. Bror is currently working on several translation projects for 1517 Publications, including Bo Giertz’s Commentaries on the Synoptic Gospels and two volumes of Giertz’s sermons, *A Year of Grace*.

Step 1. Booking your hotel accommodations:
