PURPOSE

The North American Lutheran Church (NALC) will elect a new Bishop at its 2023 Mission Convocation in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; therefore, the Executive Council of the NALC is calling for prayer to discern this position. Electing a Bishop is one of the most important responsibilities in the life of the Church and a key responsibility of the biennial Convocation. As an election, it is a process governed by the constitution of the North American Lutheran Church; however, it is also a call process. As such, it involves discernment from the perspective of both the individual potential nominees and the NALC as a whole. Engaging in prayerful reflection and seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit are indispensable aspects of the process of nomination and election of the Bishop of this Church.

Understanding that congregations pray for such events in different ways, it seemed appropriate that we offer a variety of prayer resources for the election of our future Bishop.

The provided material, collected from various worship resources and members of the NALC, is intended for use in public worship, prayer, small or large groups, and individual devotions.

INTRODUCTION

On Praying for the Leaders of the Church

Beloved, Pray for Us

We ask you, brothers, to respect those who labor among you and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, and to esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves. And we urge you, brothers, admonish the idle, encourage the fainthearted, help the weak, be patient with them all. See that no one repays anyone evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to everyone. Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. Do not quench the Spirit. Do not despise prophecies, but test everything; hold fast what is good. Abstain from every form of evil.

Now may the God of peace himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; he will surely do it. Brothers, pray for us. Greet all the brothers with a holy kiss. I put you under oath before the Lord to have this letter read to all the brothers. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.

On Praying for the Bishop

Blessed Lord, You speak to us through the Holy Scriptures. Grant that we may hear, read, respect, learn, and make them our own in such a way that the enduring benefit and comfort of the Word will help us grasp and hold the blessed hope of everlasting life. Further, we are bold to pray that You call a servant who will teach the Holy Scriptures with passion and faithfulness.



O most loving Father, open our ears and guide our tongues that, in all our conversations and deliberations, our listening and speaking might be filled with Your grace and favor as we prepare to elect our Bishop; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.



Lord God, reveal to us a Bishop filled with the Holy Spirit and who will passionately support the mission and ministries of the North American Lutheran Church; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.

Gracious and loving God, You are our Good Shepherd, in You we place our hope and trust: hear the prayers of Your faithful people, lead us to one mind and one heart in You, and show us that Bishop who will feed and tend Your flock; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Thirty Days of Prayer

DAY ONE

You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and with all your might.

—Deuteronomy 6:5

Most holy God, we Your Church call upon You to set aside a faithful servant who loves You with heart, soul, and might to minister to the saints of the North American Lutheran Church and be a fervent witness to the world; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

DAY TWO

Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

–Ephesians 6:10-12

Almighty God, You have armed Your Church well. Therefore, we are bold to call upon Your name, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, to provide strength of character and unyielding fidelity to Your servants that one may stand out to be called our next Bishop to serve Your Church and the world through faithful living and ardent praise of You; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

DAY THREE

DAY SEVEN

For the husband is the head of the wife even as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior.

–Ephesians 5:23

Gracious, eternal God, You have given us the gift of the Church, the bride of Christ, to be in a loving, faithful relationship to Christ the bridegroom. Send us a servant who will illustrate the faithfulness of the Church to her groom that the joy of this holy union may be a blessing to the world; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

DAY EIGHT

the garment of praise instead of a faint spirit.

Lord God, You sent Your Spirit that we may know Your presence among Your people. By this same Spirit, You have anointed Your Church in the life, death, and resurrection of Your Son, our Lord Jesus; our mourning has turned to joy, that in our new-found life in Christ, we may be righteous plantings of the Gospel to display Your glory to the world. DAY NINE

*...to give them a garland instead of ashes,

Father, You adorn us with a beautiful headdress and garment of praise in times of anxiety. We pray for strength to persevere in prayer, especially for the servant whom You will call to be our next Bishop, that he or she may be one who encourages us to wear the garment of Christ Jesus, our Lord and Savior. Amen.

DAY TEN

As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth. "I do not ask for these only, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one, just as you, Father, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me.

–John 17:18-21

Holy Father, You sent Christ into the world that we may know You. We pray for our Bishop to be sanctified in truth and love so that the word of his or her mouth and the meditations of his or her heart may be pleasing to Your glory; in Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

DAY ELEVEN

*Because you have made the LORD your dwelling place—
the Most High, who is my refuge—
no evil shall be allowed to befall you,
no plague come near your tent.
For he will command his angels concerning you
to guard you in all your ways.*

—Psalm 91:9-11

Almighty God, anoint a priest for the priests to serve as a sentinel for the Church militant. Protect Your holy spaces; keep them dwelling places for the Lord and a holy ground in which to serve that the plagues of the world not enter them, in the name of Jesus Christ we pray. Amen.

DAY TWELVE

The Lord is a stronghold for the oppressed, a stronghold in times of trouble. And those who know your name put their trust in you, for you, O LORD, have not forsaken those who seek you.

—Psalm 9:9-10

You, O Lord, do not forsake those who seek You. Raise

up leaders who gain their strength from knowing and trusting in You; we pray in Jesus' name. Amen.

DAY THIRTEEN

And I sought for a man among them who should build up the wall and stand in the breach before me for the land, that I should not destroy it, but I found none.

–Ezekiel 22:30

Almighty God, we seek a faithful leader who supports the Church by being a hedge around the Gospel. Where there are cracks in the walls of faith, may our new Bishop stand steadfast and bind up the weakness as a witness to the power of the Gospel who is Jesus, our Lord and Savior. Amen.

DAY FOURTEEN

I hope in the Lord Jesus to send Timothy to you soon, so that I too may be cheered by news of you. For I have no one like him, who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. For they all seek their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ. But you know Timothy's proven worth, how as a son with a father he has served with me in the gospel. I hope therefore to send him just as soon as I see how it will go with me, and I trust in the Lord that shortly I myself will come also. I have thought it necessary to send to you Epaphroditus my brother and fellow worker and fellow soldier, and your messenger and minister to my need.

–Philippians 2:19-25

O Lord our God, You have called us to be a family in Christ; therefore, be with our new Bishop who, like a parent, may direct and encourage us in faith, life, and witness to the Gospel. Amen.

DAY FIFTEEN

Philippians 2:19-25 (see Day Fourteen).

O Lord our God, provide a servant leader who is genuinely concerned for Your Church and for all fellow workers in the Kingdom of God, in Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

DAY SIXTEEN

But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.

—Galatians 6:14

Lord, we pray that our new Bishop, like Paul, will boast in the glory of the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

DAY SEVENTEEN

Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.

—Romans 5:3-5

We give You thanks, Holy Father, that through suffering and testing You give Your people endurance, character, and hope that Your love may be poured into our hearts. Thank You for the gift of prayer and this time of discernment as we prepare to elect a new Bishop who will understand times of suffering, that the ultimate love of God, Jesus Christ, may be proclaimed with unending joy. Amen.

DAY EIGHTEEN

Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace.

–Ephesians 6:13-15

Almighty Father, source of everlasting light, we ask that our new Bishop not only bear the armor of God but display the breastplate of righteousness, the belt of truth, the helmet of salvation, the sword of the Spirit and shoes by which to lead us in this life of faith and service to You; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

DAY NINETEEN

Jesus said to him, “Be gone, Satan! For it is written, “‘You shall worship the Lord your God and him only shall you serve.’ ”

–Matthew 4:10

Lord God, bring us a Bishop with a strong worship life that encourages the spiritual life of our leaders, that they may be strong in spirit and grounded in the Gospel of our salvation, Jesus Christ, our Lord, in whose name we pray. Amen.

DAY TWENTY

And [Jesus] could do no mighty work there, except that he laid his hands on a few sick people and healed them. And he marveled because of their unbelief. And he went about among the villages teaching.

—Mark 6:5-6

Almighty and everlasting Father, provide the North American Lutheran Church with a Bishop who is an agent of healing, who strengthens faith during anxious times of the Church, and who seeks out those who desire to hear the healing power of Your Word, in Christ Jesus our Lord, Amen.

DAY TWENTY-ONE

Him we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

—Colossians 1:28

Holy God, grant us a Bishop who encourages mature faith, discipleship, and proclaims the Gospel with boldness, in Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

DAY TWENTY-TWO

But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the ruler of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe."

–Mark 5:36

Lord God, our refuge and strength, bring us assurance of Your presence in, with, and through Christ. We pray that You provide a leader among us to serve as our Bishop in the years to come who will not fear, but believe in Your mighty act of salvation, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

DAY TWENTY-THREE

Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints.

–Ephesians 6:18 (NRSV)

Almighty and merciful God, we are bold to ask for a Bishop with a prayerful spirit, who keeps alert to the needs of this Church and of Your people throughout the world, in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

DAY TWENTY-FOUR

We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, since we heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints, because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. Of this you have heard before in the word of the truth, the gospel.

–Colossians 1:3-6a

God of all nations, we give thanks for the prayers of all people who call upon Your name, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; may the Gospel that has come to us bring hope to the world as we bear the message of truth in thought, word, and deed. Amen.

DAY TWENTY-FIVE

You did not choose me but I chose you and I appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you.

—John 15:16

Holy Father, apart from You nothing is true, nothing is holy. Grant us a Bishop who stays close to the vine that he or she may not wither in their leadership but continue to grow stronger and be firmly grounded in their discipleship, in the name of Jesus. Amen.

DAY TWENTY-SIX

But the anointing that you received from him abides in you, and you have no need that anyone should teach you. But as his anointing teaches you about everything, and is true, and is no lie—just as it has taught you, abide in him. And now, little children, abide in him, so that when he appears we may have confidence and not shrink from him in shame at his coming.

—1 John 2:27-28

Lord Jesus, all authority is Yours; therefore, we are bold to ask for a servant leader who, by Your anointing power and in the authority You have given Your Church, teaches all that You have commanded and does not shrink from shame but has confidence in Your saving love. Amen.

DAY TWENTY-SEVEN

But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.

–1 Corinthians 9:27
