Doing a "Progressive Supper" with three to four couples is a great way to get to know new members or just people you would like to get know better.






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The pinecone is a symbol of eternal life, but it is also a symbol of rebirth and new life. Inside pinecones we find little nuts, which are the seeds of the pine. When the pinecone falls, these pine nuts have the chance to sprout and become a new tree, symbolically "giving birth" to it.

When disasters rush through communities, there are immediate needs that the NALC Disaster Response team jumps in to address. Our warehouses provide disaster kits that are real blessings to those amid chaos and disasters. Even when our warehouses are stocked, we cannot sit back and take a break, because with one or two disasters, our warehouses are depleted of their contents. Regular collections of disaster kits and "stuff the truck" gift cards are needed. Have you scheduled any kit assembly days at your congregation? Lent is a wonderful time to collect gift cards that are so essential for those during a disaster. Just last week more gift cards were sent to Hawaii, whose needs will continue for years to come.

Even after the initial response we offer in a disaster, there are needs for months and even years in areas impacted by a disaster. Have you ever thought about the adults or youth of your congregation dedicating a few days to a mission trip to one of the continuing disaster sites? Rebuilding following major disasters takes time, people, skills, and money. The NALC Disaster Response Task Force is prepared to help you put together a mission trip.
